2004 Oklahoma Hereford and Oklahoma Cattlemen's Tour

"Hereford Heaven" was the name ranchers used in describing the ranching operations in South Central Oklahoma. Native pasture land in the limestone region of the Arbuckles support stocker grazing operations and top quality cow/calf programs throughout the area. Ranching history began with grazing leases of Indian lands in the late 1800's. With the introduction of Hereford breeding stock, the area was so-named for the concentration of Hereford genetics.

Several of the area and state Hereford breeders displayed their genetics during the 2004 joint tour of the Oklahoma Hereford Association and Oklahoma Cattlemen's Association from June 27, 20-29, 2004. The tour featured stops in the "Hereford Heaven" south central area of Oklahoma. Enjoy a photo album of the tour on page 8.

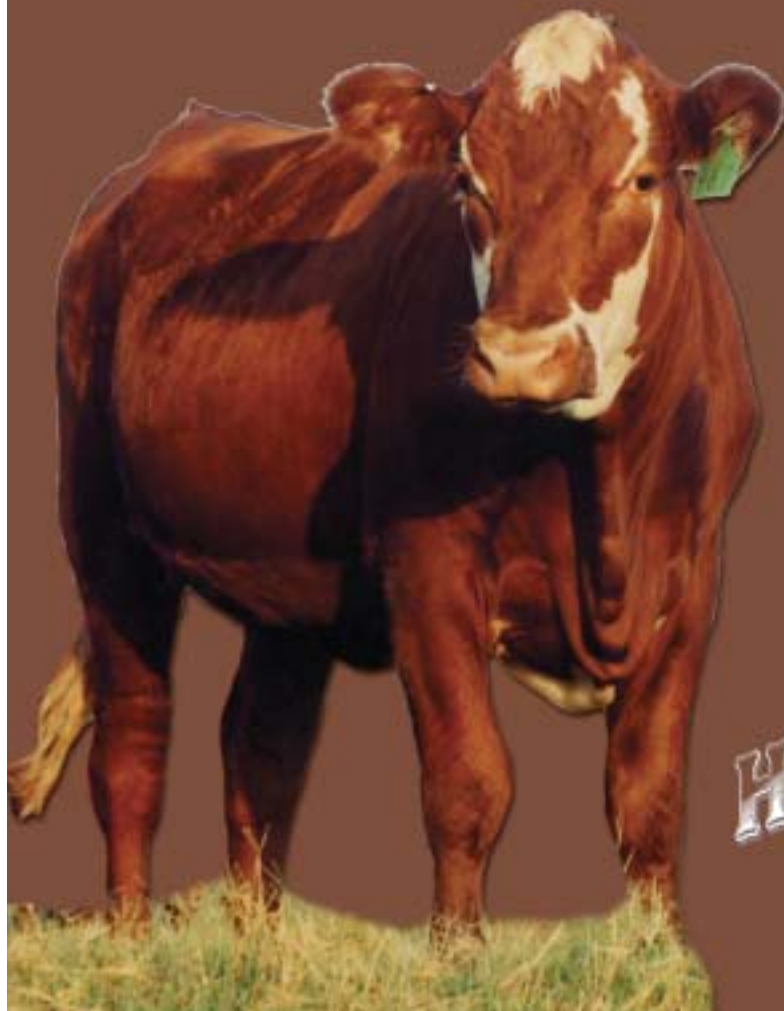

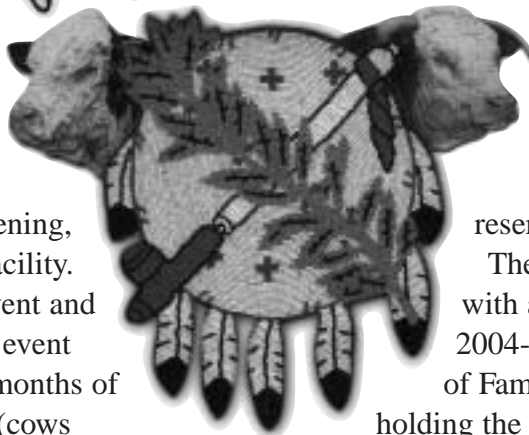

Bruce Lindsey III operates Lindsey Land and Cattle Co., L.L.C., which includes 8,000 acres of Garvin and McClain county pasture land.

Fifteen hundred breeding females and 4,000 stockers are managed on the operation. Hereford, Angus and Charolais genetics are utilized to produce a fast gaining calf that will market early.

Around 100 brood mares are kept to provide the ranch with foals to replenish the remuda and offer weanlings, yearling and breeding stock

Jacobs Ranch, Sulphur, OK

Hereford history has been written time and time again with early day volume production of Hereford genetics at the noted Turner Ranch. Foundation sires Hazford Rupert 81 and TR Zato Heir each have historic markers near the main barn. The ranch has been owned by two governors—Roy J. Turner and later by Arkansas Governor Winthrop Rockefeller. The ranch was later sold by Rockefeller and changed ownership several times before Bill Jacobs was able to secure the property in 1989.



Twelve former Turner Ranch employees were present to visit with tour guests.

Today, Bill and his son Jason operate the 12,000 acre ranch with a diversified stocker cattle

and cow/calf operation. A High tech rotational grazing program was established and today 1500 stocker steers are pastured together in one pasture and rotated every three to five days to fresh pasture. This allows a 40-45 day rest period for the pasture.
